

- 3) Record your message after the tone. When finished, you can either hang up or press the # key. If you press the # key, you'll be given options to listen to your recording, accept your recording, or re-record it.

Please feel free to share this information to others that know Clifford so they can contribute to the keep-sake as well.

Remember, this is a surprise for Clifford, so if you do talk to him, try not to say anything about this.
