August 2019 From Pastor Joyce:



I have just finished a wonderful couple of weeks working with some awesome youth and their leaders at Java & Jesus, the Youth Worship service on July 2^{1s}t, and our Youth Mission Camp which happened last week.

In the afternoon we helped out at Betty Anderson's home working on a list of tasks she had for us – we were able to complete them all with supervisory help from Karrie Anderson. We finished our day with the fun activity of tubing down the Rum River.

On Wednesday the youth led our worship by finding songs on their phones that we could all listen to and enjoy. Our work was at church cleaning and sorting items left over from VBS and other events that had taken place in the SS rooms – we re-purposed items, put things in recycling and threw a lot of junk away.
