December 2019 From the Pastor

What a joy it is to celebrate Advent and Christmas in the church each year!

Advent is to be a time of waiting, a spiritual discipline of slowing down to notice God's presence in the still small voice within a violent and hurried world. **"Be still, and know that I am**

God!" the Psalmist reminds us in Psalm 46:10.

We can get so caught up in the hustle and bustle of Christmas that we forget the reason we are celebrating. Waiting for something that has already happened is a curious practice. The Advent season plays with our notion of time. **The church gathers in the present, to ponder the past, for a future hope.**

- Finish making your 12 dozen cookies, and we appreciate any candies, breads and other goodies. We need cookies and goodies from everyone at church this year to make up for those folks we've lost.
- Set aside some jars of jelly, jam, preserves, salsa, sauce and pickles.
- Check your closets, attics & basements for new or gently used items for our treasures room.
- Also, if you are a crafter we will gladly accept any of your projects.
- Reminder there is an absolutely beautiful, pastel multi colored queen size quilt with a light blue backing, that will be raffled. Look for it on display.
- Be sure to invite your friends to meet you at the Milaca United Methodist Church for a day of Christmas cheer and shopping. Coffee and cinnamon rolls are available in the morning and a luncheon will also be served.



God's Free Gift – Saturday Dec. 14th 1 pm

Invitations will be available for you to share with families you know who might need help with gift giving this Christmas. This is not a gifts for children program, but one where we will help them give gifts to their families. We'll begin the event in the sanctuary where the families will watch a simple video or play of the Christmas story, we'll sing a few hymns, have a family picture taken in front of the tree, and they will be given a religious ornament and

an invitation to come to the Christmas Eve service. Then families will go to the Fellowship Hall where parents can enjoy cookies and the children will be assisted by a helper to "shop" for their family (up to 4 gifts per child – family maximum of 16 gifts). When they have picked their gifts they will go to another room and the gifts will be wrapped. Then they will join their parents for treats. **How you can help:** volunteer to help at the event is our biggest need – helping children shop or wrapping their gifts, provide Christmas gift bags, tape, bows or tags, provide funds to purchase gifts, and share an invitation with a family who needs this outreach ministry. Families must let us know by phone by Tuesday Dec. 10th that they are coming.

A SUGGESTION FOR CHRISTMAS EVE

OR CHRISTMAS MORNING

Gather around the tree before you open gifts and have someone read the Christmas story from Luke 2:1-7: In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he



was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Have someone read this message about sharing: This is a season of sharing: we share our time, our most beloved traditions, our favorite recipes. We share stories and memories, music and moments of worship. And we share Christmas presents, which we will open in a few minutes. These gifts are not love in themselves, but they are simple reflections of the love we have for one another and they are given in honor of a greater love – God's love for us in giving us Jesus. So we open these presents with thankfulness for Jesus and to celebrate his birthday.

Have someone pray this prayer: God of Heaven, it is You, we know, who has gathered us around this tree to share with one another the treasures that are hidden in these brightly colored wrappings...to share with one another your good gift of time together. We know you are with us too, dear Lord, sharing this time even as you shared your own dear Son that we might all be your children. For all of these gifts, we thank you and praise you. Amen.
